10 min HSS school council reports:

- Financial report Pam Barker School Council Co-chair Still not a ton to report as Rae Ann sorting through financial software and Pam sorting through ear tagged use for money. Just over \$3000 in our account. Still needs to be determined for what purpose the money should be used. Also grant money of \$500 (maybe slightly more) is to be decided how to best be used for learning.
- Communication: 1) from the school: Videos are a huge improvement and more parents and students are watching than read Kodiak Review. Effective at creating school community along with FB and Insta posts.. We are finding that some parents are still wanting it in written form. Admin described where to find 'daily announcements' on the school website for weekly snapshot of info for HS and MS. Along with the calendar that can be downloaded to your personal calendar, most of the requests are covered. 2) with the classroom: Teacher communication is going quite well. There are some complaints of a lack of teacher response. Reminder, if you have gone to the teacher and are still not getting a response after 48 hours please call the administration in the office to rule out a 'junk folder email'. If you have never communicated via email with your child's teacher, many emails are going to spam. As we are introducing newer better ways of communicating we appreciate your patience while working or troubleshooting technical errors. Parent council and the school staff encourage all communications following the process of the teacher first, then include admin if satisfactory results have not occurred. 3) from school council- Inza is working on slides for parent council communication. We will disseminate our info in collaboration with the office (email, videos, FB and Insta posts) Topics such as meeting summary (what we talk about and what you missed), who we are, goals, how to communicate with teachers, collaboration and creating community etc.
- Parent Matters report Tracy Brown Ewert Google meet with parent representatives from schools throughout CESD. Led by Superintendent Kurt Sacher. This group meets 3 times a year and the purpose is to give a voice to the parents. Provide a vision and allow parents to connect and communicate with each other. 20 min Principal's Report: Dean Nielsen, Kristina Rentz, Teri Sadek

- Key updates in policy, programing, communication
- Parent Teacher interviews coming up November 6th and 7th book online. Bookings close on Monday October 30th.
- Would like to collaborate with elementary schools in order to make it feel like one school K-12.
- Supporting High school in career options. Going to have a career day. Shut the school down for the morning and bring in parents/ members of the community in different fields. This will be for grades 9-12 in the am. Then a presentation for grades 7 and 8 students and potentially grades 5-6 in the afternoon. Tentative day Dec 15th.

- Discipline working towards a consistent smooth process and have implemented the 1,2,3 method. One means a kid needs a break. Really a teacher/student solution that may be supported by an administration. Two means something has gone on such as disrespectful behaviour. Administration will work with the teacher/student and if needed, the parent to work on repairing the relationship. VP's primarily deal with '1 and 2' situations. Number threes are behaviour requiring suspension and this role is taken on by the principal. Student/parent/principal are involved in this situation. There has been a decrease in office referrals from last year and most calls to the office are number ones.
- Our school is currently a nut free school it has been looked into as some parents are expressing
 a desire to allow nuts. We are going to look into making our school nut aware. This means that
 students would be able to bring peanut butter or nuts to school but also be aware of allergy
 needs among us. The teacher would be aware of a student with an allergy and accommodate.
 Expect further discussion to formulate the actual plan. Parent discussion always welcome
 throughout this process.
